The Diatribe Co-Founder and Executive Director (2013 - 2023)

- Utilized restorative art to challenge historical systems of oppression, reimagining education, and fostering community well-being through The Diatribe's unique approach, creating an unapologetic vision for liberation accessible to all.
- Established a multimillion-dollar nonprofit organization, successfully filing articles of incorporation, and spearheaded remarkable revenue growth, elevating organizational income from \$80K in 2018 to nearly \$4M in 2023.
- Raised \$3.5 million through state lobbying for "The Emory Arts and Culture Hub" in the South Division/Grandville Corridor of Grand Rapids.
- Developed a robust board of directors with supportive committees to enhance organizational effectiveness.
- Orchestrated "The 49507 Project," managing a team to install 17 murals in the 49507 zip code, crafted by Black and Brown artists and co-created through extensive listening sessions.
- Secured a \$1M lead capital support pledge from the Wege Foundation, demonstrating effective fundraising leadership.
- Inspired and led a dedicated team of contractors to support programs, operations, and fundraising efforts.
- Facilitated impactful programming, maximizing grant impact, and ensuring equitable compensation for artists and teaching staff.
- Created and disseminated free, downloadable, interactive content for remote education over Zoom, including prompts, presentations, and digital journals.
- Spearheaded adaptive fundraising event management during the challenges of COVID-19 and implemented a cloud-based storage system for streamlined document access, managing donor relations, and strengthening partnerships with community organizations.

- Instrumental in the successful completion of three impactful murals, transforming the visual landscape of the area.

- Played a key role in securing \$3.5 million in state revenue, dedicated to advancing crucial development initiatives in one of the city's underinvested areas.

Public Poetry Projects

- The Diatribe (2013 2023): A nonprofit organization dedicated to utilizing creative writing as a therapeutic tool for young individuals navigating complex emotional experiences. Their mission involves empowering students to express their thoughts on sensitive topics such as abuse, neglect, parental separation, bullying, and sexual trauma through poetry. This initiative fosters safe and open dialogues within schools. Collaborated with nearly 30 schools, impacting over 15,000 students. Currently engaged with 10-15 public schools annually.
- The Retort (2014-2020): A prominent weekly nightlife event in Grand Rapids, MI, renowned for featuring bimonthly performances from poets across the United States. It significantly contributed to the city's poetry and cultural scene. Hosted distinguished artists, including Danez Smith, Hanif Willis-Abdurraqib, and Buddy Wakefield.
- Poetry, Art, and Mental Health Showcase (2017 & 2018): A well-attended annual event blending artistry and community advocacy, featuring crisis prevention organizations, therapy/psychology resource centers, and holistic healing providers. Attracts over 200 attendees. Provides a platform for 10 artists to share their mental health experiences and struggles, encouraging support-seeking.
- Youth Poetry & Art Series (2018): A collaborative project involving artists from West Michigan, fostering Ekphrastic Poetry creation. Recognizing the best 30 youth writers, the initiative awarded \$1000 in cash prizes and sponsored 9 weeks of free summer writers' workshops by The Diatribe.
- The Grand Showcase Annual Poetry Festival (2018): Positioned as "West Michigan's largest poetry showcase for a purpose," this evolving event aspires to become a premier poetry festival in Michigan and the Midwest. In its inaugural year (2018), headlined by Andrea Gibson, it attracted nearly 700 attendees.Subsequent editions featured renowned poets such as Rudy Francisco, Ebony Stewart, and Brieáne Black Rose Kapri, maintaining strong community engagement with approximately 700 attendees each year.
